XXXX PRE-SEASON WRAP UP



The 1992, XXXX Soccer League Pre-Season Tournament again followed last years format, in that the twelve (12) XXXX League Clubs and top 4 Division 2 Clubs were drawn into four Qualifying Groups.

To add a little more excitement in the Qualifying matches, games ending in a draw went to a shoot out. Not a penalty shootout, but player verses goalkeeper with a ten second time limit to score from the halfway line. The XXXX Shootout was used on three occasions, with a varied degree of success and marksmanship from the strikers.

Traditionally, the wet weather strikes in February/March thus causing some matches to be postponed, this year was no different, but only two nights matches were washed out and successfully rescheduled.


BRISBANE NORTH SEASON OPENING

If Soccer is to continue to advance in this state it is essential that we formulate a stable and uniformed development plan.

A clear direction is needed for both players and coaches to encourage high performances.

The Queensland Soccer Federation Development Program has been established to promote an ongoing progressive improvement of knowledge and expertise for players and coaches as they move through the levels of self development.

It is important that Queensland has a development plan that identifies and defines aims and objectives for the future.

For the Development Plan to be successful it is vital that there is an input and cooperation sought from the Queensland Junior Soccer Council, Regional Directors of Coaching, The Coaches Association, Women's soccer, Referees, Brisbane United, Clubs and Administrators.

We need to work together to help make that dream come true.

Player Development:

- * Queensland Development policy for boys and girls.
- * Testing programme for the early identification of talented players.
- * Strike Force development coaching clinics. Strike Force Clinics will be conducted in Brisbane and Regional areas these Easter Holidays. They will cater for grass roots development with emphasis on skill practices and fun based participations.

Academies of Soccer Development.

We are currently in the early stages of establishing organisational and structural procedures for the Queensland Academies of Soccer Development.

The four Regional and State based Academies will be conducted throughout Queensland for boys and girls who wish to develop their individual and team soccer skill to the highest level.

The Academies will offer players the opportunity to acquire new skills under the guidance of professional coaches and senior players, while experiencing first hand the dedication needed and training methods used for elite player development.

Coach Development:

- * Coaching Courses to suit the candidates' needs are being co-ordinated for Junior, Senior Coaches and Staff Coaches.
- * Coaches who have confidence in different areas of the game will be used in coaching demonstrations, lectures, seminars etc.
- * Training programs for the development of staff coaches for coaching courses, coaching clinics and academies will be implemented.
- * Seminars for State Team coaches. Senior and XXXX League Coaches with invited interstate or overseas instructors.
- * A data and literature centre for club coaches to obtain update information.

WOMEN'S SOCCER

At the last South Queensland Women's Soccer Association's Annual General Meeting in November, Life Memberships were granted to Lyn Ketter and her husband Guenter Pfuhl. Lyn has been a club and representative player, a club and representative coach, and an administrator over the past fifteen years. Guenter, who began coaching club teams in the '70's, has been a State Coach for the past ten years.

Lyn was also re-elected as President of the Association, to be known in future as Women's Soccer Queensland, as the association takes on the administration of soccer for the entire state.

Regular meetings with country affiliates was one of the first changes to be introduced, the first of which was held at Southport Soccer Club on the Gold Coast on 29 February. All affiliates represented, voted to keep the present Executive Committee as the controlling body for the time being until a new constitution is drawn up. The affiliates look towards voting in an Executive or Board to begin operation in 1993. At present, two meetings will be held each year, both to take

place within the area which is hosting the State Titles for that year. This gives the other affiliates a chance to see the venue and arrange accommodation in February for their trip to the state Titles in June, when the second meeting is held.

Along with Fay and Allan Dower, Terri and Scott Gellatly, Nea Karamias, John Page, Nola Behan, and Samantha O'Brien, who were all re-elected to the Executive, Matthew O'Brien took on the job of Carnival Organiser. Samantha and Matthew will no doubt get some good advice from dad, Denis O'Brien, who is the newly re-elected President of the Australian Women's Soccer Association.

WATSON SHIELD

Although it was disappointing to see only twelve teams enter this year's Watson Shield, the 18th time this annual pre-season carnival has been held, those teams who did enter, enjoyed a great weekend of soccer on March 8 and 9. The Gold Coast sent two teams and one came from the Sunshine Coast. All three made the semi-finals so the trip

was worth it. Sunshine Coast were the winners of the Consolation Cup over North Star 3-1 and Eastern Suburbs won the Watson Shield over Acacia Ridge 1-0.

This year's Atlanta Cup grading competition is under way with a total of thirty-six teams in open divisions for 1992. With the addition of 6 Under 15 teams, the Brisbane competition looks like being a busy one. Newcomers to Women's Soccer are Margate, Slacks Creek, Clairvaux and Goodna.

Last year's Division 1 Grand Finalists and Premiers, Redlands, have disbanded, with President Lyn Ketter, giving up coaching this year due to the extra burden of administrative duties. Most of the team have reformed at Acacia Ridge, with some others at Wynnum and Brisbane City.

Annerley from 1st Division have reformed with their coach at Brisbane Lions and Redcliffe, also from 1st Division in 1991 have also dispersed with their coach moving on to Coalstars. Grading competition over the next few weeks, which doubles as the Atlanta Cup competition, will set the scene for a great season of soccer.

Amendments to Law 12 and decisions of the International F.A. Board

(15) If, in the opinion of the referee, a player who is moving toward his opponent's goal with an obvious opportunity to score a goal is intentionally impeded by an opponent, through unlawful means, i.e., an offence punishable by a free kick (or a penalty kick), thus denying the attacking player's team the aforesaid goal-scoring opportunity, the offending player shall be sent off the field of play for serious foul play in accordance with Law XII (n).

Refereeing with Des Miles

(16) If, in the opinion of the referee, a player, other than the goalkeeper within his own penalty area, denies his opponents a goal, or an obvious goal scoring opportunity, by intentionally handling the ball, he shall be sent off the field of play for serious foul play in accordance with Law XII (n).

(17) The International F.A. Board is of

the opinion that a goalkeeper, in the circumstances described in Law XII 5 (a), will be considered to be in control of the ball by touching it with any part of his hands or arms. Possession of the ball would include the goalkeeper intentionally parrying the ball, but would not include the circumstances where, in the opinion of the referee, the ball rebounds accidentally from the goalkeeper, for example after he has made a save.

COMMUNITY AWARENESS

Contact Sports and Infections

Athletes involved in contact sports or sports which may involve body contact must be aware of the risks involved in the voluntary transfer of body fluids, especially blood. This happens if an athlete has a bleeding injury. It is possible that a small amount of blood could be transferred from one player to another.

The two important infections when considering this are AIDS and HEPATITIS B. Players may have these infections and not be aware of them.

Unfortunately, AIDS infection cannot be prevented by immunisation; but Hepatitis B infection can be. It is strongly recommended that players, coaches, umpires/referees, trainers and first-aid personnel are immunised against Hepatitis B. It is hoped that

sporting associations and Clubs will accept the responsibility of encouraging their athletes to be immunised.

Palm Beach coach David Smith has enlisted the services of Gamblers' Edmond Dixon, Andrew Lees and John Denham to add to his

Dimbulah staged its Lino Gagno Shield the following weekend and again it was the Leichhardt Lions that came away victors, winning on goal deference from fellow Cairns club Stratford.

The Far North Queensland Soccer Federation has done well to secure a beverage sponsorship for senior competitions this year. The Pre-season Cup, on March 6, began the 1992 season incorporating ladies, youth, reserve and first division.

Pre-season finals and the Presidents Trophy are set down for April 11 and 12 with the regular fixtures due to start after the Easter long weekend.

Although there is going to be fewer teams contesting first division in 1992, a new division is set to be introduced to cater for the reshuffle and new teams.

The aim is to increase the standards in the higher divisions, while allowing youth players to move up to more experienced ranks.

In the First Division, it will be Leichhardt that defends its crown as Premiers after dominating last years three rounds. Another Cairns side, Edge Hill United, will have the job of retaining the Champions title after the 1991 Finals' series.

The Far North Queensland Soccer Federation will be contesting all Representative competitions this year, starting with the Sunshine Cup in April and then continuing with the new look Queensland Cup from early May.

Newly appointed Far North Queensland Soccer Coach, Brian Stopford, a Physical Education teacher at Cairns High School, has already started training with a preliminary squad for what is going to be a busy representative year.

Having reached the top as both player and coach at all levels, Stopford has had a long association with soccer in the Far North, including schoolboy and Far North Queensland teams.

With a number of players in various divisions from ladies to youth set for selection at the highest levels again this year, 1992 should see soccer in the Far North take another step in the right direction.

NORTH QUEENSLAND

North Queensland Soccer has gone through many changes in recent years, and 1992 will see even more.

Townsville based N.Q.S.F. instigated the formation of Townsville Kern United Soccer Club to compete in what was then the new Queensland State Soccer League.

What an upsurge was experienced in the area when the local populace had the opportunity of witnessing live, a standard of soccer never seen in the city before.

The success of the Townsville Kern United team in winning the Ampol Cup (twice), and State League Premiership in the early eighties is now history.

Whilst success boosted soccer in North Queensland, the pride of those clubs in the South of the State was severely dented.

It was therefore little surprise when the State League competition, in it's original form, changed to exclude clubs as T.K.U.

Not a "State League", but at least one step up from purely local competition, and a stride forward in our "Fight Back".

This season has seen two new clubs affiliate with the N.Q.S.F., Idalia Rovers, one of the oldest clubs in the North, after a short absence from the senior scene have nominated a team for the Third Division.

New Club, Charters Towers United, have also nominated a team. "Titleys Tigers", for the Third Division. This is the first time that Charters Towers have ventured into Senior Soccer, although they have had teams in the N.Q. Junior competition previously.

N.Q. Soccer is fighting back. It may take time to achieve a final goal but they're on their way forward once again.

The 1992 Soccer season is just about to start and everyone involved, both junior and Senior, is looking forward to a successful season.




