





Classic encounter of two gifted sides

The Strikers play South Melbourne tonight as the race for finals positions hots up in the latter third of the season.

With the Strikers place in the six a good bet at this stage, the team must reproduce its recent scintillating form against Wollongong to secure a position in the top two on the ladder.

South Melbourne is just one point out of the top six and if league leaders Sydney United play to form and defeat fifth placed Marconi Fairfield, a win could see the southerners back in a finals play-off position.

History shows that tonight's match-up will be a classic encounter between two gifted sides.


The teams have met on 12 occasions in the national league, with the Lakers sure to be still smarting after we dealt them a 2-1 defeat down at their place in Round 4.

Brisbane has won five of its six encounters at home while in Melbourne, the score is three-one to South Melbourne with two draws.

Despite the fact that South Melbourne has not won in Brisbane since season '92/'93, it would be a brave pundit who would dare discount a team that possesses talent the likes of current Socceroos Jason Polak, Warren Spink and Paul Trimboli, as well as Young Socceroo Michael Curcija and New Zealand international Vaughan Coveny.

Strikers player/coach Frank Farina said South Melbourne captain Paul Trimboli was one player his team would need to watch.

"Trimboli played well for the national team recently and has been the backbone of

their side this season," he said.

"Nick Orlic has also put in some strong performances and he is especially dangerous from set pieces."

South Melbourne has a long tradition in Australian soccer circles being one of only three clubs to have played in all 21 seasons of the national league.

The team has an impeccable pedigree with three league championships, four runners-up titles and four third placings.

Farina said: "They're a good side who have had some results go against them in the past few weeks".

"Considering the events of last week, they might be happy to get away from the pressures of their home crowd.

"I believe they'll come to Suncorp firing and we'll need to be at the top of our game to ensure we come away with the best possible result." □

Retirement is the *Wright* move for Danny

"At this stage in my career, it's a highlight to get on the park.... Every moment of every game is precious," says Danny Wright, one of the Ericsson Cup's most respected players.

He paid his dues as a 15 year old with Brisbane Lions in 1980 in the then Philips National League and has since enjoyed a fruitful 17 year career highlighted by 10 appearances for the Queensland senior side, 12 caps for the Australian youth team and a national championship with South Melbourne in 1991.

With retirement looming at season's end, Wright is comfortable with his decision to pursue a career in the hospitality industry with his wife Eleonora.

"It's very pleasing to me that a lot of the guys I grew up with such as Frank, Brownie and Alan are playing out their days at the Strikers," he said.

"We all went our separate ways to further our careers but now find ourselves playing together once again which all makes for a great atmosphere at the club."

Wright was a foundation player with the Strikers and has played four seasons with the team. He is also the longest serving player in the national league.

Danny said he came to Brisbane from South Melbourne at a time when Queensland Soccer was in limbo.

"I was prepared to retire from competitive soccer when I returned to Brisbane," he said.

"However, Clem Jones, Ian Brusasco and Frank Speare got together and invited me to play for the club. I have been very happy with my decision."



The 32 year old started his career as a striker, but the passing of time has coincided with a move to the defensive end.

"I've lost a yard or three so my current defensive midfield role with the team probably suits me best."

In the last couple of seasons, Wright's "Mr Versatility" tag has proved advantageous to his career.

"The modern game demands people who are capable of playing total football, and my experience has enabled me to slot into a variety of positions."

It's this experience that Wright hopes will help him to maintain a position in the Strikers line-up and enable him to once more experience the joy of winning a national championship.

Wright said player/coach Frank Farina has played a major role in the emergence of the Strikers as a force in the national league.

"Frank and I played together with the Australian youth side," he said.

"It's fantastic to be playing with someone who not only is a friend but shares similar philosophies and views on the game.

Danny's qualities as a player on and off the field will be missed by all. □

Welcome back Willow

Craig Williams has returned to the Brisbane Strikers after a successful stint in Singapore and is keen to play a part in their charge towards the 1997 premiership.

"Willow" was an important part of the Strikers historic season last year in which the team made the Ericsson Cup finals for the first time.

At the end of the season Craig felt the need to prove himself overseas and he and his wife moved to Singapore where he secured a contract with Tampinese Rovers.

"I had a fantastic time in Singapore and it was definitely the right decision, particularly from a financial perspective" he said.

"It was also a great experience to be able to be totally focused on the game as a fulltime soccer player."

The uncompromising defender made 22 appearances for Tampinese Rovers with the side reaching the semi final of the local knockout competition, before returning to Australia during the off-season.


"I had intended to return to Singapore for the 1997 season but a change of management at the club unfortunately put an end to that," he said.

Craig had been training with the Strikers for the past couple of months with a view to securing a new contract, but had been unable to do so due to the abundance of talent at the club this season.

He was then approached by Queensland state league new-boys Bundaberg and accepted a deal to take part in the inaugural season of the XXXX Premier League.

Since then long term injuries to key players including Soccerroo Sean Cranney and skipper Alan Hunter have seen the

The Strikers approached Bundaberg in a bid to have Craig released from his contract and have now completed negotiations which will allow him to return to the national competition.

"I have said to Bundaberg I am happy to help them in any way I can but I have it written into my contract that the Ericsson Cup comes first," Craig said.

Strikers coach Frank Farina is pleased to have Craig rejoining the Strikers and expects him to fit comfortably back into the side.

"We're delighted to have Willow back as he will add some extra aggression and experience to our defence."

Craig is also pleased to be back with the Ericsson Cup high flyers saying he enjoyed his time with the club before his stint in Singapore and is keen to play a part in the Strikers challenge for this season's premiership.

"When I moved up here from Parramatta in 1992 to join the then Brisbane United it proved one of the best decisions I have ever made and I'm very pleased to be back." □

Danny Wright changes career direction


Strikers all-rounder Danny Wright, a veteran of almost 350 National Soccer League matches, will be retiring this season after a professional soccer career spanning 17 years.

The Lakers - A brief history

The year 1959 saw the joining of three strong Melbourne clubs. Hellenic, Yarra Park and South Melbourne United. Of these clubs it appears that South Melbourne United was the oldest, formed in the early 1930's.

Despite big expectations, South Melbourne had a very mixed start to the national league. A low point in Souths' twenty-one year national league experience was 1979. The club had three competition points deducted after it was deemed that import player Tony Turner had not been properly registered with Souths. Three coaches, along with high profile Socceroo players Jack Reilly, Jimmy Mackay and Jim Armstrong all left the club that year, which saw Souths finish the season last.

While we have to go back four years since South Melbourne last won in Brisbane, there has not been a win by any Brisbane-based national league team in Melbourne (prior to this season) since Brisbane City won 2-0 at Middle Park way back in 1981.

Souths did secure first position on the final league ladder (southern division) in 1984. But in this year, a restructure of the national league meant that, for the first time, the minor premier were not champions.

Souths had to win the finals series to be declared true champions of 1984. The club powered through the southern division finals series, defeating arch-rivals Heidelberg in the southern division grand final before a 15,000 crowd. Souths then won out over Sydney Olympic 2-1 in both legs of the 1984 national grand final.

Brisbane boy Danny Wright, currently the longest serving national league player, played nearly 200 games for Souths between 1987 and 1993.

Souths finished all five seasons from their knockout cup-winning year of 1990, until 1994, in the top three. In the midst of this extended halcyon period, a massive crowd of 23,318 gathered to watch probably the most enthralling national league grand final ever in May 1991. Here Souths defeated Melbourne Knights - albeit on penalties - after two hours of intensive on-field action.

A recent move to the impressive Bob Jane stadium has injected new life into the club, after the 'failure' - by Souths' high standards - of the last couple of years. One of only three clubs to have played in all twenty-one seasons of Australia's premier football league, Souths supporters are hungry for another championship soon. □



"Because Frank is a great exponent of the game, he manages to create a lot of team spirit by making people feel comfortable.

"He's willing to take a gamble with the younger players and selects on form rather than reputations.

"Away from soccer, I also admire a guy like Stefan Edberg because eventhough he is a high profile athlete he hasn't let it go to his head."

Reece said the most memorable moment of his career to date was the game against Sydney United in Round 13 when he played in front of 13,000 fans.



In his spare time, Reece likes to play tennis, go to the beach or catch a movie.

He is currently studying marketing at Kangaroo Point but for the moment is content to pursue his footballing career.

"My goals are to play for the Australian youth team, then the Olympic team with the ultimate goal to represent my country at senior level," he said.

"I have some relations in Holland and if the opportunity arose I would like to play overseas."

While I have no doubt that the long distances we travel for away matches has an influence on the players mental preparation, the fact is that we have just not played well.


In saying this, it would be unfair to judge the players as a whole as there have been some good individual performances.

The Cup is a new innovative competition involving 18 Under 13 teams from throughout S.E. Queensland.

If scores are even at the end of the second leg, the winner will be determined by applying the following methods in order. 1: Away goals rule. 2: First team to score in the second leg match. 3: Toss of the coin.

The rules of the competition are simple. There are four players on each team with two extra players making unlimited interchanges.

Matches are split into two halves, with the first played during half time of the curtain raiser and the second half played during the break in the main game.

There are no goalkeepers so handling of the ball is illegal.

No more than one defender at a time can be positioned inside his own penalty arc but any number of attacking players are allowed in the arc and there is no offside rule.
